- 2. Committee Called to Order at 6:08 pm
- 3. April Meeting Minutes
- 4. Sub-committee Updates
 - a. Dog Park (Misiag, Taft, Burke)
 - i. Sub-committee met to scope out dog park
 - ii. Goals and Ideas for improving the park with \$6,000 budget
 - 1. Remove the rotted wooden benches
 - 2. Host a 1-hour timeslot for Dog Park cleanup on Saturdays
 - 3. Distribute gift cards from Pups-and-Pound to engage neighbors
 - 4. Dog Toy Chest
 - 5. Add benches to perimeter, could incorporate public art
 - 6. Leash hang up
 - 7. Agility course
 - iii. Tony makes a motion to give the Dog Park sub-committee permission to explore the above ideas and look more into prices of equipment or supplies along those guidelines. Crary seconds the motion, committee passes this vote unanimously
 - b. Third Street Park (Schaffer)
 - i. Three Main Goals- Build a relationship with the Minneapolis Park Board, create an official park proposal, and create public awareness for the park
 - 1. Engagement: Host two public events held for the park

- 2. Submit a proposal to the Minneapolis Park Board that meets expectations
- 3. Put forth programming proposals with specific metrics
- 4. Add a small sign in the park to denote its public status
- Size recommendation- five P+P members will be enough for this subcommittee; specialized volunteers will be needed for fundraising and events
- iii. Update from Crary on July 10th Food Truck Fair- no trucks can go on the park property, but patrons can sit in the park and play games. The subcommittee will work with Scott Woller from the NLNA board on the food truck fair and a movie in the park
- c. Zero Waste Subcommittee (Burke)
 - i. Goals-Triple A Method
 - 1. Awareness- 4 informational events a year
 - a. Provide information on composting, store drop off, recycling, and specialized recycling
 - b. Lobbying for buildings to adopt compost/organics pickup
 - c. Looking to partner with NLNA board for a revamped digital presence
 - 2. Accessibility
 - Aiming for five apartment buildings in the neighborhood to adopt organics program by February 2023 (10% of apartment complexes in the North Loop)
 - b. Create more public drop-off locations
 - c. North Loop Green is interested in becoming a public dropoff site
 - d. Host two special recycling events in the next term
 - 3. Adoption
 - a. Double current organics participants from 200 to 400 by next February
 - b. Looking to put out a neighborhood survey for awareness
 - ii. Burke makes a motion to recruit two members to the Zero Waste Sub-Committee, Cristy Blake and Sammy Gauer, Crary seconds the motion, the motion passes
- d. North Loop Green (Taft, Burke)
 - i. Update from In-person meeting with Marquee Developers
 - 1. Development is going to have a 1-acre outdoor park space with lots of programming
 - 2. North Loop Green is interested in doing a few community listening sessions with North Loop residents
 - ii. North Loop Neighborhood Association will post Marquee Developer's survey to neighbors https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/NLNA2022
 - iii. Not much P+P can do until construction starts, but the partnership is there

- e. Public Art
 - i. No update this month
- f. Tractor Works (Crary)
 - NLNA Board is pushing TractorWorks project for approval with the Minneapolis Parks Board
- g. James I. Rice Park (Crary)
 - i. Approved for Parks and something next year
 - ii. Following the plans of Friends of the Mississippi
 - iii. Using this plan to push the Minneapolis Park Board to move forward
 - iv. Burke met with folks with a proposal to bring goats to the James I. Rice Park to graze
 - 1. trying to get it funded by Nature Valley
 - 2. Burke feels confident about August Proposal
 - 3. Estimated to be \$20k a year
- 5. Wiki Tool Demo (Schafer)
 - a. Proposal for Parks + Placemaking to use a wiki instead of the shared Google Drive to stay more organized
 - b. Tool is called Notion. It allows access to one spokesperson per committee. Anyone can access the site, so content can be shared with the public. Shafer proposes P+P uses the free tier, if it picks up P+P could opt to use the paid tier
 - c. Shafer asks if the committee would be interested in using this, and if so, will one chair per sub-committee be willing to add information
 - i. Shafer will do the initial setup
 - ii. Burke makes a motion to adopt the wiki, Taft seconds the motion, the vote passes unanimously
